THE ORGANISATION OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

The aim of this course to present and examine the basic administrative bodies (both central and peripheral of the Greek State), which form the social policy of the country, assisted also by other institutional actors. Within this framework, at first, a presentation of the key organisational systems of administration are presented, namely, centralisation, decentralisation and self-government, as well as the institutions of hierarchical control, administrative supervision and administrative appeals. Then, the central governing bodies (the President of the Republic, the Government, the Prime-minister, the Ministers - exclusively in their administrative dimension), the peripheral governing bodies (the General Secretariat of decentralised administration, the Ministers of spatial competence) and the local government of 1st and 2nd degree, are examined. The course ends with an examination of the public entities for special purposes (Insurance Funds, Public Enterprises, Universities etc.).
